rain date: Sunday, October 15th, with same departure time



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
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

Join us for 16 scenic miles by bike, as we circle our fair city's Western perimeter, tie the knot in the center of Cambridge, then loop around the Eastern border. This will be a gorgeous Autumn ride, at an easy pace on mostly level terrain. For those looking for a shorter ride, the half-a-loop option ends near Harvard Square where Oktoberfest will be in full swing.

All are invited to untie with us post-ride at Lechmere Canal Park (behind the Cambridgeside Galleria Mall), where food and drinks will be provided by a generous sponsor. We will return to Cambridge Common after refreshments.
